TRANSPORTATION INFORMATION

If you are traveling by commercial airline, you will be arriving at the new Dallas/Fort Worth (DFW) Airport, the world's newest and largest. The size of and distance between the terminal facilities make it difficult to meet everyone personally, and experience has shown that the quickest and most satisfactory means of travel to and from the airport is via the new transportation service known as Surtran (\$2.50 per person, ome way). Since it is not practical to have a central arrival booth, we recommend that you take Surtran to downtown Dallas (Union Station) where we will have transportation to the Seminary available or can arrange to pick you up if you call (824-3094).
