ANNOUNCEMENT OF TWELFTH ANNUAL MEETING

TRAVEL DIRECTIONS. By car: from U.S. Highway #1, 16 mi. north of Boston take Mass. Highway #128 northeast to Exit 7. The Divinity School grounds are adjacent to Exit 7.

By train: both the New Haven and N.Y. Central serve Boston. From the North Station in Boston take the Boston and Maine R.R. to the Beverly Farms or Hamilton-Wenham stations. Transportation to the Gordon campus may be had by making arrangements in advance or by telephoning on arrival. Dr. Goddard will send R.R. schedules on request.

By plane: from the Boston airport take a shuttle bus to the subway and transfer to a North Station car at Scallay Square Station, or use a limousine to North Station; and take the B. & M. to Gordon as above.
